Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to object to the proposals in the Draft NDF to allow wind turbines to be built across large parts of Wales, especially central Anglesey.

Such turbines are unacceptable on several grounds, in particular that they ruin the landscape, create significant noise affecting both residents and wildlife, and they make little or no contribution to the security of our electricity supply.

Solar farms are less intrusive, and should be given priority over wind turbines. Nevertheless, the great attraction of solar panels is that they can be put on existing buildings and brownfield sites. It should be possible for example, to build solar farms using fill-in areas such as unused land between buildings on existing industrial estates such as the Gaerwen industrial estate or on parts of the land adjoining Mona airfield.

Wales is not short of derelict industrial land which could be used for solar farms.

Neither wind turbines nor solar farms should be permitted on greenfield sites in rural areas.

I hope the Draft NDF will be revised to remove the provisions allowing such development.
