Population and wellbeing assessments

We continue to work with a number of Public Services Boards across Wales to support the production of the local assessments of well-being required by the Well Being of Future Generation's Act. We have been supporting the collation, analysis and presentation of data. We are also beginning to offer support on the evidence base needed to facilitate the transition of this work into the planning process required during the coming year.

Our work to support the production of the population needs assessments required by the Social Services and Well Being Act has largely been completed and we are supporting the transition to area plans. An early stage of this process will be an update and reissue of the data catalogue released in December 2015 to reflect the changes in available data and policy focus to allow for a strong and consistent evidence base to be available for the development of the plans. We are currently engaging with leads in each region to understand how the catalogue has been used and to ensure its relevance going forward.
