Summary

This circular provides actuarial guidance for Scheme Managers in relation to Age Additions and Assumed Age Additions in accordance with Regulations 35 and 36 of the Firefighters' Pension Scheme (Wales) Regulations 2015.

The Firefighters' Pension Scheme (Wales) 2015: Age Additions and Assumed Age Additions

Background

- Responsibility for firefighters' pension schemes in Wales is devolved to the Welsh Ministers under the Fire and Rescue Services Act 2004 and the Public Service Pensions Act 2013. The Firefighters' Pension Scheme (Wales) Regulations 2015 came into force on 1 April 2015.
- 2. The Welsh Ministers have responsibility for the actuarial guidance for the 2015 Scheme factors after consultation with the Scheme Actuary. Scheme Managers (Fire and Rescue Authorities) are then required to implement the factors as detailed in the guidance.
- 3. Similar to factor reviews for the 1992 and 2007 Firefighter Pension Schemes, the approach for setting the factors and assumptions for the 2015 Scheme factors is that they are determined using the principle of actuarial equivalence using a "cost to scheme" approach (ie that the exchange of benefits is cost neutral from a scheme perspective).
- 4. All factors will be reviewed periodically which will depend on changes in the actuarial assumptions or following each cycle of future valuations of the Firefighters' Pension Scheme (Wales) 2015.
- 5. Scheme Managers and administrators should ensure that they use these latest factors.

Age Additions and Assumed Age Additions

- 6. The actuarial guidance note attached to this circular at Annex 1 relates to Age Additions and Assumed Age Additions in accordance with Regulations 35 and 36 of the 2015 Scheme Regulations. It sets out the general method for assessing the additions that should be applied in accordance with the Regulations.
- 7. This guidance relates only to benefits accrued under the 2015 Scheme Regulations. Some firefighters may also have benefits under the 1992 Scheme or the NFPS which should be dealt with separately according to relevant scheme guidance.
