Mae Gweinidogion Cymru wedi ymgynghori â Phrif Swyddog Heddlu Dyfed-Powys ac wedi rhoi hysbysiad cyhoeddus o'u bwriad i wneud y Gorchymyn hwn yn unol â rheoliadau 5(1) a 6(1) o Reoliadau Gorchymionnion Traffig yr Ysgrifennydd Gwladol (Gweithdrefn) (Cymru a Lloegr) 1990(2).

ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A489 Trunk Road (Machynlleth, Powys) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2021

Made 2 February 2021
Coming into force 5 February 2021

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A489 trunk road, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

The Welsh Ministers have consulted with the Chief Officer of Dyfed-Powys Police and given public notice of their intention to make this Order in accordance with regulations 5(1) and 6(1) of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1990(2).

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A489 Trunk Road (Machynlleth, Powys) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2021 and it comes into force on 5 February 2021.

2. In this Order—

“exempted vehicle” (“cerbyd esempt”) means:

 - (b) unrhyw gerbyd sy'n cael ei ddefnyddio at ddibenion y llynges, y fyddin neu'r llu awyr ac sy'n cael ei yrru gan berson sydd am y tro yn ddarostyngedig i orchmylion aelod o luoedd arfog y Goron, sy'n aelod o'r lluoedd arbennig—
 - (i) ac sydd wedi ei hyfforddi i yrru ar gyflymderau uchel ac sy'n gweithredu wrth ymateb, neu wrth ymarfer ymateb, i argyfwng diogelwch gwladol; neu
 - (ii) at ddiben hyfforddi person i yrru cerbydau ar gyflymderau uchel;
- ystyr "y gefnffordd" ("the trunk road") yw cefnffordd yr A489 Caersŵs i Fachynlleth; ystyr "lluoedd arbennig" ("special forces") yw'r unedau hynny o'r lluoedd arfog y mae Cyfarwyddwr y Lluoedd Arbennig yn gyfrifol am gynnali eu galluoedd neu sydd am y tro yn ddarostyngedig i reolaeth weithredol y Cyfarwyddwr hwnnw.

Cyfyngiad

3. Ni chaiff neb yrru unrhyw gerbyd modur, ac eithrio cerbyd esempt, yn gyflymach na 40 milltir yr awr ar y darn o'r gefnffordd ym Machynlleth, Powys sy'n ymestyn o bwynt 275 o fetrau i'r gorllewin o'i chyffordd â ffordd sirol ddiddosbarth yr U227 (Cyffordd Dolguog) hyd at bwynt 103 o fetrau i'r dwyrain o'r gyffordd honno.

Llofnodwyd o dan awdurdod Gweinidog yr Economi, Trafnidiaeth a Gogledd Cymru, un o Weinidogion Cymru.

(3) Diwygiwyd adran 87 gan baragraff 55 o Atodlen 1 i Ddeddf y Gwasanaethau Tân ac Achub 2004 (p. 21), paragraff 42 o Atodlen 4 i Ddeddf Troseddu Cyfundrefnol Difrifol a'r Heddlu 2005 (p. 15), paragraff 29 o Atodlen 8 i Ddeddf Troseddu a'r Llysoedd 2013 (p. 22), ac adran 50(4) a (5) o Ddeddf Dadreoleiddio 2015 (p. 20).

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(3);
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

"special forces" ("lluoedd arbennig") means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director; and

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A489 Caersws to Machynlleth trunk road.

Restriction

3. No person may drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road at Machynlleth, Powys that extends from a point 275 metres west of its junction with the unclassified county road U227 (Dolguog Junction) to a point 103 metres east of that junction.

**THE A489 TRUNK ROAD (MACHYNLLETH,
POWYS) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2021**

The Welsh Ministers have made an Order in exercise of their powers under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which comes into force on 5 February 2021.

The effect of the Order is to introduce a 40 mph speed limit on the length of the A489 trunk road at Machynlleth, Powys that extends from a point 275 metres west of its junction with the unclassified county road U227 (Dolguog Junction) to a point 103 metres east of that junction.
