# ATISN - 15283 - C J - 153: Covid 19 Ferret Register Wales

Thank you for your request which we received on 29th June. You asked for copies of the scientific documents, evidencing the susceptibility of Ferrets to SARS-CoV-2, their ability to transmit the virus within their species and potential to produce variants of the virus.

The information you have requested is freely available online. The steps taken to protect public health from the infection with dangerous variants have been based on scientific research into the susceptibility of mammals to the virus. This evidence has also informed the guidance issued by the Welsh Government and other GB administrations relating to SARS-CoV-2 and the potential risks presented by ferrets and other *Mustelinae*.
