I wrote to you on 2 July regarding your request for information.

Information requested

You asked for the for the following information since the introduction of a 50mph speed limit between junctions 41 and 43 on the M4 -

The levels of the pollutants of concern in the vicinity of this stretch of motorway on a monthly basis since the introduction of the 50mph speed limit and those appertaining before the limit was introduced to facilitate a fair comparison.

Our Response

I confirm that the Welsh Government does hold the information caught by your request which can be seen below –
