#### ATISN 15404 - Isolation of COVID-19 virus

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 08 August 2021 regarding the isolation of Covid-19 virus. You asked for the following:

To provide copies of all records in the possession, custody or control of the Technical Advisory Cell describing the isolation of a SARS-CoV-2 virus, directly from a sample taken from a Covid-19 diseased patient, where the patient sample was not first combined with any other source of genetic material.

Please inform me what your recommended RT-PCR Test Cycle Threshold is? Has this changed recently and, if so, when and why did it change?

### Response

The information being requested is readily available and previously published, therefore has been exempted under Section 21 on the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
