Nice to meet you all earlier.

In terms of examination costs, as you will be aware from looking at the relevant schedule of fees, each examination will vary in total cost mainly based on the number of Inspector days spent on the examination. As well as the fixed fees and the hourly and daily rates set by the fees regulations, there are also 'actuals' costs incurred in the examination that are passed on to the applicant (e.g. Inspector Travel and Subsistence costs or, where necessary, Welsh Government legal fees). We do not publish any records of past examination costs.

The following table shows the number of Inspector days charged on past examinations. Together with the available information on fees (summarised in the attached document), I hope this will help you with your estimates.

In terms of timescales for determination, Section 62L of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) sets a 36 week determination period (252 days from formal acceptance to the final decisions). This determination period can be suspended if necessary, e.g. to allow submission of further information / consultation on that information. Minus any suspension time, all decisions to date have been issued within the 252 days.

I am very pleased to be able to write to you for the first time regarding a new DNS project of ours – Y Bryn Wind Farm, located on NRW managed forestry land between Port Talbot and Maesteg.

I would very much appreciate the opportunity to introduce you to the project, where we are up to and what our planned trajectory is, if somebody might be available for a Zoom/Teams/Skype call sometime over the next fortnight or so?

Briefly, Y Bryn is a scheme comprising up to 26 turbines and battery energy storage. The site was tendered by NRW in 2018; Coriolis Energy and our development partners ESB were identified successful bidders in mid-2019. We have been undertaking bird surveys since winter 2019/2020, and will shortly be looking to submit a Scoping Report, likely to be early in the new year.

Public consultation was planned to commence from early 2021, but has now been delayed until the Spring when hopefully the Covid situation will have relented somewhat. We do have a Draft Consultation Plan that we're also planning to consult with you on, alongside the relevant LPAs – Neath Port Talbot and Bridgend.
