#### ATISN 15727 - Isolation of COVID-19

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 30 November relating to the isolation of covid19. You have requested the following:

- 1. Proof that COVID-19 has been isolated in a laboratory?
- 2. Proof that COVID-19 has been isolated and taken from a pure sample from an infected being with COVID-19?
- 3. Proof that COVID-19 has been found in a diseased human, and not found in healthy humans?
- 4. Proof that COVID-19 has been extracted and isolated from an infected human?
- 5. Proof that COVID-19 will cause disease when introduced to a healthy human?
- 6. Please supply empirical evidence that a link has been made between Covid19 and SARS-Cov-2 virus and proof that a causal relationship (koch's Postulates) has been established between a set of symptoms named SARS-Cov-2 and Covid19 using live samples not computer produced sequenced data.
- 7. The Nobel Prize winner Kary B. Mullis, inventor of PCR said this test 'should never be used as a tool in the diagnosis of infectious diseases'. Please explain why it is being used to test for Covid19.
- 8. Can you provide an explanation/evidence that masks apparently stopped the spread of influenza but apparently they have not spread the Covid virus.
- 9. As fully vaccinated people can catch and spread Covid19 (and possibly be unaware that they have it) why are vaccine passports being issued and unvaccinated people being discriminated against?
- 10. The Gov say that vaccinations have greatly reduced Covid19 symptoms in the vaccinated who catch it. Please provide empirical evidence that this is true, especially as the same government state that symptoms vary greatly in people, from no symptoms to severe symptoms.
