ATISN 16007 - COVID autopsies

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 24 January 2022. You asked the following questions -

- 1) Please supply deaths caused solely by covid-19, where covid-19 is the only cause of death listed on the death certificate, broken down by age group and gender between Feb 2020 up to and including Dec 2021 in Wales.
- 2) Please supply the number of autopsies carried out on those where covid-19 was the only cause stated.

I can confirm Welsh Government does not hold the information requested.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) collect and produce mortality statistics for England and Wales based on information collected from the death registration process. They publish monthly statistics on deaths due to Covid-19 (i.e. where Covid-19 was identified as the underlying (main) cause on the death certificate), which are broken down by month, area, gender and age. Alongside the monthly release the ONS also <u>publish</u> quarterly information on pre-existing conditions mentioned on the death certificate of deaths due to Covid-19. The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) publishes coroner statistics for England and Wales, including information on autopsies/post-mortem examinations.
