

**GORCHYMYN CEFNFFORDD YR A40  
(CYLCHFAN PEN-SARN I GYLCHFAN PONT  
LESNEVEN, CAERFYRDDIN, SIR  
GAERFYRDDIN) (GWAHARDD CERBYDAU  
DROS DRO ) 2022**

Mae Gweinidogion Cymru wedi gwneud Gorchymyn o dan adran 14 o Ddeddf Rheoleiddio Traffig Ffyrdd 1984. Mae angen y Gorchymyn er mwyn gwneud gwaith ar gefnffordd yr A40, neu gerllaw iddi, rhwng Cylchfan Pen-sarn a Chylchfan Pont Lesneven yng Nghaerfyrddin, Sir Gaerfyrddin.

Effaith y Gorchymyn yw gwahardd dros dro bob cerbyd, ac eithrio'r rhai a ddefnyddir gan y gwasanaethau brys neu ar gyfer y gwaith, rhag mynd ar y darn o gefnffordd yr A40 sy'n ymestyn o'i chyffordd ag ochr orllewinol Cylchfan Pen-sarn hyd at ei chyffordd ag ochr ddwyreiniol Cylchfan Pont Lesneven.

Y llwybr arall i gerbydau sy'n teithio tua'r gorllewin yw mynd ar yr A40 tua'r gogledd-ddwyrain i Gylchfan Llangynnwr, ar Heol Llangynnwr tua'r gorllewin, ar yr A484 tua'r gogledd a'r A4242 tua'r de-orllewin i ailymuno a'r A40 yng Nghylchfan Pont Lesneven: i'r gwrthwneyb ar gyfer traffig sy'n teithio tua'r dwyrain.

Daw'r Gorchymyn i rym ar 26 Mawrth 2022. Dim ond ar y gerbytffordd tua'r dwyrain y disgwylir i'r gwaharddiad dros dro fod yn weithredol, o 20:00 o'r gloch ar 26 Mawrth hyd 06:00 o'r gloch ar 27 Mawrth 2022. Disgwylir y bydd y gerbytffordd tua'r gorllewin ar gau o 20:00 o'r gloch ar 2 Ebrill hyd 06:00 o'r gloch ar 3 Ebrill 2022 neu hyd nes caiff yr arwyddion traffig dros dro eu symud ymaith yn barhaol.

Dim ond yn ystod y dyddiadau a bennir uchod y disgwylir i'r Gorchymyn fod yn weithredol. Er hynny, bydd yn parhau'n ddilys am gyfnod o 18 mis ar y mwyaf rhag ofn y bydd angen ailamserlennu'r gwaith neu wneud gwaith canlyniadol neu waith arall. Bydd hysbysiad ymlaen llaw am unrhyw newidiadau i'r amseroedd a'r dyddiadau yn cael ei arddangos cyn gwneud unrhyw waith a ailamserlennir.

**THE A40 TRUNK ROAD (PENSARN  
ROUNDABOUT TO PONT LESNEVEN  
ROUNDABOUT, CARMARTHEN,  
CARMARTHENSHIRE) (TEMPORARY  
PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES) ORDER 2022**

The Welsh Ministers have made an Order under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which is necessary to undertake works on or near the A40 trunk road between Pensarn Roundabout and Pont Lesneven Roundabout at Carmarthen, Carmarthenshire.

The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit all vehicles, other than those being used by the emergency services or for the works, from proceeding on the length of the A40 trunk road that extends from its junction with the western side of Pensarn Roundabout to its junction with the eastern side of Pont Lesneven Roundabout.

The alternative route for westbound vehicles is via the north-eastbound A40 to Llangynnwr Roundabout, westbound Heol Llangynnwr, northbound A484 and south-westbound A4242 to rejoin the A40 at Pont Lesneven Roundabout: vice versa for eastbound traffic.

The Order comes into force on 26 March 2022. The temporary prohibition is expected to operate on the eastbound carriageway from 20:00 hours on 26 March until 06:00 hours on 27 March 2022. The westbound carriageway is expected to be closed from 20:00 hours on 2 April until 06:00 hours on 3 April 2022 or until the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

Although the Order is only expected to operate on the dates specified above it will remain valid for a maximum period of 18 months, as a contingency, should the work need to be rescheduled or consequential or other work is required. Advance notice of any changes to times and dates will be displayed before any rescheduled work.
