ATISN 16490 – Impact assessments undertaken in relation to local tax changes for second homes and self-catering holiday lets

Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 20 July. You asked for:

- The impact assessments that were undertaken in relation to the new tax regime that is being introduced for second home owners and holiday let businesses in 2023 in Wales, where owners will have to pay 400% council tax if they don't meet the 182 letting threshold.
- 2. In particular, the impact the changes will have on local tourist communities in a worst case scenario, for example, what would happen if all second home owners put their properties on the market, and holiday let businesses closed leading to job losses in various local sectors like cleaning, maintenance, hospitality, etc.

Our response

The Welsh Government carried out a Regulatory Impact Assessment in preparing the Non-Domestic Rating (Amendment of Domestic Property) (Wales) Order 2022, which can be found at: https://senedd.wales/media/40gf3dzl/sub-ld15122-em-e.pdf

The Welsh Government also carried out a Regulatory Impact Assessment in preparing the Council Tax (Long-term Empty Dwellings and Dwellings Occupied Periodically) (Wales) Regulations 2022, which can be found at: https://senedd.wales/media/h4pbo1ud/sub-ld14989-em-e.pdf

The Welsh Government does not hold any data on the number of second homes that are expected to be sold, or holiday let businesses that are expected to cease to operate as such, as a result of the changes.

The Welsh Government does not hold sufficient data to accurately assess the impact on local economies and the tourism sector, or the impact on employment. The introduction of legislation is, in part, intended to bring about behaviour change which would increase the proportion of properties that meet the new letting criteria.
