## Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 25th August 2022. You asked for:

- 1. A breakdown of how many exchanges are expected to be undertaken in total in (a) 2022/23 and (b) 2023/24 between all the Pathway 1 large multiyear projects which have been awarded to date under the Taith learning exchange programme.
- 2. How many civil servants or other officials (a) are currently working on the Taith project and (b) have worked on the project since it was devised in 2021.

## Our response

Q1 - I have included a table which outlines the data for outward and inward mobility numbers of successful applications (based on what has been included in the application forms of beneficiaries). These numbers are subject to change as projects progress, so they are, to a large extent, indicative at this stage. The Higher Education sector is predominantly comprised of 3-year projects therefore mobilities are largely spread over 3 academic years. NB these numbers indicate mobilities of learners and staff:

- Q2. The International Tertiary Education team within Welsh Government manage Taith, along with other responsibilities, and is currently comprised of 4.200 FTE staff members.
- 14 members of Welsh Government staff have worked, in some capacity, on Taith since its inception; this figure does not include members of the finance team who have assisted in an

ancillary capacity. Time committed by staff members has varied depending on the expertise and input required at each stage.
