ROAD TRAFFIC

THE TRUNK ROAD (BUILTH WELLS, POWYS) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1979

MADE 25 JULY 19-19
COMING INTO OPERATION 13th August 1979

The Secretary of State for Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 (a) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the Dyfed, Powys Constabulary, hereby makes the following Order:-

This Order shall come into operation on the 13th August and may be cited as the Trunk Road (Builth Wells, Powys) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979

2.(1) In this Order:-

"the trunk road" means the Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (A483);

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities! Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975(b);

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975(c); and

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4631:1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:-
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle; and

- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing fowards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on either of the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on either of the sides of the road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878(a);
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
 - (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to either of the said sides of road.
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position both a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on either of the sides of road referred to in that article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).



6. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE

- (i) The south side of that length of the trunk road known as Garth Road at Builth Wells in the County of Powys which extends from its junction with Hospital Road in a general westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.
- (ii) The south side of that length of the trunk road known as Garth Road at Builth Wells in the County of Powys which extends from a point 85 metres west of its junction with Hospital Road in a general westerly direction for a distance of 40 metres.
