Thank you for your request which I received on 17 October. You asked for:

- 1. How does the Welsh Government apply for Foreign Direct Investment?
- 2. How is this funding allocated?

Our response

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government.

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) is investment made by companies and corporates across the private sector that can result in a number of outputs, including new facilities / offices being established, an expansion of existing operations, acquisitions, joint ventures or even investment into projects or activities in a given location.

Given this, the Welsh Government does not apply for FDI, but promotes the strengths and capabilities in Wales to attract it, as set out in the Welsh Government's International Strategy:
