## Request for Information – ATISN 16762

Thank you for your request for information which I received on 17 October. You asked for the following information on 5G technology:

- 1. Can you please tell me the adverse reactions that 5G has on not only the human body but also plant life?
- 2. Can you please tell me what effect 5G would have on a human body that has high levels of metals in it?
- 3. Can you please tell me what evidence you have of any adverse reactions to the human body from 5G & it's technologies?

## Our response

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government.

Although responsibility for plant health and the wider public health of the Welsh population is devolved to the Welsh Government, health and safety considerations of 5G technology is not devolved to Wales.

Responsibility for holding public health information on this matter rests with the UK Health and Security Agency (UKHSA).

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) is responsible for all public health matters associated with radiofrequency electromagnetic fields (EMF), or radio waves, including in relation to 5G, and the Welsh Government takes into account their advice on wider public health issues. UKHSA's main advice on EMF levels and their impact on human life can be found here <a href="Mobile phone base stations: radio waves and health - GOV.UK">Mobile phone base stations: radio waves and health - GOV.UK</a> (www.gov.uk) which reflects and complies with the internationally agreed EMF levels from the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) Guidelines ICNIRP.

The Welsh Government does not hold any information on the impact of 5G on plant life.
