Information requested

Thank you for your request, which we received on 13 November 2022. You asked for a list of all schools in Wales who are currently or planning to serve school meals containing insects.

Our response

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, it has been established that the information you have requested is not held by the Welsh Government.

All local authorities and schools in Wales are required to adhere to the <u>Healthy Eating in Schools (Nutritional Standards and Requirements) (Wales) Regulations 2013</u>. These set out the type of food and drink which may be provided during the school day. The Regulations are accompanied by the <u>Healthy eating in maintained schools statutory guidance</u>. This guidance is statutory, and local authorities are required to adhere to it. The Welsh Government has no plans to encourage local authorities to serve school meals containing insects.

Privacy Notice

The request you sent me contains personal information about you - for example, your name and address. The Welsh Government will be the data processor for this information and, in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation, it will be processed in order to fulfil our public task and meet our legal obligations under the Act to provide you with a response.
