## ATISN 16987 - Health Funding

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 17 December 2022. You have requested the following:

- 1. the total funding received by Wales to spend on healthcare
- 2. the total funds spent on healthcare in Wales
- 3. any information Welsh Government hold which enables a comparison to be made between the level of funding provided for healthcare in England and that provided to Wales
- 4. any information Welsh Government hold which enables the accuracy the claim that, for every £1.20 which is allocated to Wales for healthcare spending only £1.05 is actually spent, to be verified).

## **Our Response**

 In the 2021/2022 financial year, the Welsh Government received £25.99 billion funding from a number of sources including the UK Government. An important aspect of the devolved settlement is that the funding received is not hypothecated by the UK Government for spend of any area, rather these are decisions for the Welsh Government and scrutinised by the Senedd.

- The total funds authorised to be spent on healthcare in Wales are detailed within the documentation for the Welsh Government budget. The second supplementary budget for 2021/22 (link above) provides details of our planned spend on Health and Social Services.
- 3. The Country and Regional analysis published by HM Treasury provides detailed comparisons of public expenditure on various services between the regions and nations of the United Kingdom. The most recent publication covers up to the 2021/22 financial year and can be found here: <a href="Country and regional analysis: 2022 GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)">Country and regional analysis: 2022 GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</a>

It shows that relative expenditure per person on Health and Social services in Wales during 2021/22 was 14% higher than that in England.

4. The Welsh Government does not hold any information to enable the accuracy of the claim to be verified from the comparison quoted. As set out above funding is not

provided specifically for expenditure on healthcare and we are unable to speculate on the sources of information for the claim.
