Request for Information – ATISN 17006

Thank you for your request which I received on 28 December 2022. I apologise for the delay in responding to you.

Your Request

You have asked for the following information:

- 1. Has Swansea Council and Welsh Government started to check the floors and ramps of older Multi Storey Car Parks in Swansea (public and private) - for safety of old concrete to see if they are capable of bearing load increases of up to 300 tonnes?
- 2. If not, do Swansea Council and Welsh Government intend such checks?
- 3. Are small rural road bridges to be inspected for strength for heavier electric vehicles?
- 4. If this is to be done, are Swansea Council and Welsh Government setting a budget for not only inspection but possible civil engineering strengthening?

Our response

I can confirm the Welsh Government holds some of the information you have requested.

For questions one and two, building regulations only apply when building work is being undertaken. Where it is proposed to erect a new or undertake structural work to an existing enclosed car park to which the building regulations apply, the loadings associated with proposed work would need to be submitted, assessed and approved by a building control body (Local authority building control or private approved inspector).

For question three, Welsh Ministers are responsible for the Strategic Road Network. Local Authorities are responsible for Local Roads. Bridges on both the Strategic Road Network and Local Roads are required to be adequate for goods vehicles weighing up to 44 tonnes (as indicated here:

HGV maximum weights - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Any bridges (and other highway structures such as culverts and retaining walls) that are not adequate to carry goods vehicles that meet the maximum weight limits are required to have formal weight restrictions. The weight of cars is not significant in terms of loading of highway structures. As such, no specific inspections of highway structures are planned to be carried out for electric vehicles.
