## **ATISN 17127 - GPs**

Thank you for your email to the Welsh Government for information received on 02 February. You have requested the following:

- 1. How many GP's are there currently working in Wales?
- 2. What is the average number of days worked per week by the GP's?
- 3. What is the average hours per day worked by the GP's?
- 4. What is the average number of daily face to face appointments by the GP's?
- 5. When GP's surgeries are funded, do they have to commit to any minimum standards, if so, what are these standards?

## Response

- 1. How many GP's are there currently working in Wales?
  - There are 2,301 fully qualified GPs working in Wales (as of 30 June 2022). This includes partners, providers, salaried, retainers and active locums.
- 2. What is the average number of days worked per week by the GP's?
  - Welsh Government does not hold data on the average number of days worked per week. Practices report the full time equivalent (FTE), i.e., the number of hours a staff member works per week. One FTE is measured as 37.5 hours per week.
  - The FTE as of 30 June 2022 was 1,562.6.
- 3. What is the average hours per day worked by the GP's?
  - As above, Welsh Government does not hold data on the average number hours per day worked. Practices report the full time equivalent (FTE), i.e., the number of hours a staff member works per week. One FTE is measured as 37.5 hours per week.
  - The FTE as at 30 June 2022 was 1,562.6.

- 4. What is the average number of daily face to face appointments by the GP's? Welsh Government does not hold this information.
- 5. When GP's surgeries are funded, do they have to commit to any minimum standards, if so, what are these standards?
  - GP Practices provide services and are funded through a contractual relationship with NHS Wales, managed by individual Health Boards. The

contract held between the health board and practice must set out the days, hours, and the service they are contracted to provide. Health boards are responsible for monitoring the services delivered under the GMS contract.

## **Next Steps**

The request you sent me contains personal information about you - for example, your name and address.
