## ATISN 17143 – FOI request Re: consents for heather burning in Wales

## Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 10/02/23. You asked for:

A copy of all statutory consents for heather burning in the following areas:

- 1. Garn Wen, Bal-Bach and Bal Mawr Moor
- 2. Beacon Hill, Moelfre & Llanbister
- 3. Ffwddog Ridge
- 4. Llangynidr Moors
- 5. Gladestry
- 6. Ireland Moor
- 7. Ruabon Moor

## Our response

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government as no specific statutory consents are required for heather burning. The Heather and Grass Burning code for Wales explains that burning is permitted during specific times of the year. Burning is allowed only between 1 October - 31 March in upland areas and 1 November - 15 March elsewhere. A licence is required to burn at other times of the year.
