Request for Information - ATISN 18772

Further to your request for information which I received on 26 July 2023. You asked for the following information relating to the M4 between Jt24 Coldra to Jt28 Tredegar Park:

- 1. Number of accidents on that stretch for the year periods 2020, 2021, 2022
- 2. Survey feedback from road users since the introduction of the fixed 50mph speed limit
- Average time taken per vehicle to travel from junction 24 to 28 for the year periods 2020, 2021, 2022 at the peak travel times (7am -9am and 3pm 7pm) and in each direction.
- Emission levels of nitrogen dioxide (NO2) pollution for the monthly periods for the year periods 2020,2021,2022 using On-road testing mobile equipment known as Portable Emissions Measurement System (PEMS).

I can confirm we hold some of the information for Q1 and Q4. We do not hold any information for Q2 and Q3. No survey has been conducted and we do not have information on the average speed of traffic.

Data extracted from 2020 to 2022

Travel restrictions in 2020 and 2021 due to COVID-19 likely resulted in reduced road collisions. The figures cover only road collisions reported to the police involving personal injury. We do not collect information on road collisions that do not involve a casualty. Collision severity describes the severity of the injury sustained by the most seriously injured casualty in the collision.

Q4. We hold some of this information, but I have concluded, however, that it is exempt from disclosure under Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, information otherwise available.
