Information requested

Regarding Beaufort research "Welsh Government – Public Attitudes to 20mph". (2022). You have requested the following –

1. The period over which the Beaufort research was undertaken.

2. The costs to the Welsh Government of this research.

3. What number of responses did Beaufort consider to be a statistically sound basis for their findings

- 4. The actual number who were invited to respond as part of the research.
- 5. The actual number who responded.
- 6. What was the definition of 'People' referred to in the leaflet.

7. The basis used to calculate from those who responded as supporting a lower speed limit from the research, to the 63% of people living in Wales statement in the leaflet.

Our response

The majority of the information requested can be seen at <u>20mph public attitudes</u> <u>survey: further research (gov.wales)</u> and <u>The state of the evidence on 20mph speed</u> <u>limits with regards to road safety, active travel and air pollution impacts: August 2018</u> (<u>gov.wales</u>). A survey of a representative sample of 1,002 adults across Wales was carried out in November 2020 using the Wales Omnibus survey. For question 2, Beaufort Research were commissioned by the Welsh Government to assess public attitudes towards a default 20mph speed limit on restricted roads in 2020 at a cost of £30,138.
