Following a Strategic Review of Education in Powys the council launched a new strategy for transforming education in Powys 2020-2030. The 10-year strategy contains four strategic aims and one of those aims is to "Improve access to Welsh-medium provision across all key stages." In addition, the council's Welsh in Education Strategic Plan for the next decade will be fully aligned with the education transformation strategy.

At present, discussions are ongoing regarding the location of Welsh-medium secondary provision in the county and no proposal has gone before Cabinet to date.
