Request for information - ATISN 19327

Thank you for your requests which I received on 24 November 2023. You asked for:

All correspondence between Marubeni and the Welsh Government - both politicians or officials - since 3rd February 2023 concerning or mentioning the HyBont project?

Our response

From my preliminary assessment I estimate that it will cost more than the appropriate limit set out in the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 to answer your request. The appropriate limit specified for central government is £600. This represents the estimated cost of it taking over 24 hours of time to determine whether we hold the information and to thereafter locate, retrieve and extract it.

Section 12 of the FOIA allows a public authority to refuse to deal with a request where it estimates that it would exceed the appropriate limit to:

- either comply with the request in its entirety or;
- confirm or deny whether the requested information is held.

Regulation 4(3) of The Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulation 2004 states that a public authority can only take into account the costs it reasonably expects to incur in carrying out the following permitted activities in complying with the request:

- determining whether the information is held;
- locating the information, or a document containing it;
- retrieving the information, or a document containing it; and
- extracting the information from a document containing it.

For central government bodies, the appropriate limit will be exceeded if it would require more than 24 hours work to undertake the tasks above in order to respond to a request.

This request is substantially the same as 19311 where I stated, inter alia,

However, I think it would be reasonable to narrow the scope of your request to policy divisions known to have had contact with Marubeni based on the scope of your previous request history.

Limiting the search term to mention of HyBont captures the same information as we considered under that request. As I said in that response, there are at least eight officials who would have the bulk of correspondence, but not the entirety. We asked one official to identify information that may be in scope and they located 130 items. However, each item must be opened and read to see if it does fall in scope of the request. This is a manual process, and we expect this would take approximately 2 minutes per item.

Based on this sample alone, 130 items across 8 officials at 2 minutes each gives just under 35 hours of work. This exceeds the appropriate limit, and even so does not provide a guaranty that it captures all such correspondence.

You may wish to refine your request by narrowing its scope by being more specific about what information you particularly wish to obtain.

Instead of writing a request that simply captures a large volume of correspondence, perhaps you could tell us what the information is that you are hoping to find in that correspondence. We would be happy to assist you in your searches for that information.

If you do refine your request in this way, this will be treated as a new request.

Next steps

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:
