ATISN 20035 – Parking charges and fines at St Joseph's and Royal Gwent hospitals in Newport

Thank you for your email received on 28 December 2023 which will be dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act (2000). You have requested the following:

In relation to the period of 1 November 2023 to 27 December 2023:

- 1. Is it free to park at these hospitals?
- 2. For how long can a visitor or employee park their car each day?
- 3. Do staff get free parking or is there a standard rate that they must pay per working day?
- 4. Is there a designated staff car park separate from visitors?
- 5. How many parking fines were issued in both hospitals between this period?

Our Response

The Welsh Government does not hold the information that you have requested.

For clarity, St Joseph's hospital is a privately run hospital and would operate its own car parking arrangements separate to the NHS. In respect of the Royal Gwent Hospital, we suggest that you contact Aneurin Bevan University Health Board in writing to
