Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 31 January 2024. You have requested the following:

- 1. In what capacity has Marian Wyn Jones worked with or for Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board since January 2023?
- 2. When did/does her position start and finish?
- 3. How much was/is she paid monthly and in total?
- 4. From what source was the money paid to her?
- 5. Who made this appointment?
- 6. Was this appointment advertised?
- 7. What is/was the job specification for this post?
- 8. What documents has she written for/about BCUHB since January 2023?
- 9. Please provide me with copies of all documents she wrote.
- 10. What role was/is she playing in the appointment of BCUHB board members.

Our Response

Question 1 – 9, Welsh Government are not aware of Marian Wyn Jones being employed by Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board to undertake any work during 2023. Welsh Government have not entered into any agreement with Marian Wyn Jones to support Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board over the last 12 months.

Question 10, Marian Wyn Jones Marian was the panel member for the Independent Members (IM) recruitment in October 2023 and is also at panel member for the current IM recruitment.

Health Board Chairs select/suggest independent panel members, The requirement is that the individual is independent of Welsh Government and of the appointing body. Health Board Chairs usually use members from other NHS bodies, and Marian Wynn Jones is an independent member on the Digital Health and Care Wales Board.

The agreed daily rate for panel members is £270 per day plus travel allowance. For the recruitment process in October Marian's total claim was £826 (1 day sift, 2 days of interviews and travel to Llandudno Junction).

I have attached emails related to the recruitment – see **annex 1**. We have decided that some of the information caught within these emails is exempt from disclosure

under Section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act. As a result, you will see that this information has been redacted. The reasons for applying this exemption are set out in **annex 2** to this letter.

Next steps

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:



Annex 2

Freedom of Information Act 2000: Section 40(2)

Section 40(2) together with the conditions in section 40(3)(a)(i) or 40(3)(b) provides an absolute exemption if disclosure of the personal data would breach any of the data protection principles.

'Personal data' is defined in sections 3(2) and (3) of the Data Protection Act 1998 ('the DPA 2018') and means any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual. An identifiable living individual is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of the individual.

We have concluded that, in this instance, the information caught by your request contains third party personal data.

Under Section 40(2) of the FOIA, personal data is exempt from release if disclosure would breach one of the data protection principles set out in Article 5 of the GDPR. We consider the principle being most relevant in this instance as being the first. This states that personal data must be:

"processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to the data subject"

The lawful basis that is most relevant in relation to a request for information under the FOIA is Article 6(1)(f). This states:

"processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller or by a third party except where such interests are overridden by the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject which require protection of personal data, in particular where the data subject is a child".

In considering the application of Article 6(1)(f) in the context of a request for information under FOIA it is necessary to consider the following three-part test:

- **The Legitimate interest test**: Whether a legitimate interest is being pursued in the request for information.
- **The Necessity test**: Whether disclosure of the information/confirmation or denial that it is held is necessary to meet the legitimate interest in question.
- **The Balancing test**: Whether the above interests override the interests, fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject.

Our consideration of these tests is set out below:

1. Legitimate interests

Your request includes some emails which were caught by your request. I have not identified any legitimate interest that you may have in knowing the identities of those individuals named within the emails.

2. Is disclosure necessary?

We do not believe disclosure of the identities of those involved would allow any greater understanding of the draft plan.

3. The balance between legitimate interests and the data subject's interests or fundamental rights and freedoms

As we do not believe disclosure of this personal data is necessary, there is no requirement on us to undertake a test to balance the legitimate interests against the right of individuals, as the fundamental rights and freedoms provided by the DPA are not being challenged.
