Data regarding a stretch of M4 between J36 and J37, specifically on the west bound carriageway near marker 275B, approximately 3.1 miles West of J36.(from August 2014 onwards)

Our Response


I can confirm that we hold information relating to your request which has been attached. The table shows the number of collisions that occurred on the M4 motorway and within a one kilometre radius of the marker post 275/8 on the westbound carriageway.

Please note we also publish <u>accident level data</u> on StatsWales with each collision's location.
