## Location

Set back slightly from the NW side of a country road which leads W off the A470 to S of the village of Trawsfynydd. Tyn Twll is along the W shoreline of Llyn Trawsfynydd.

## History

May be a late C17 or early C18 farmhouse, a clearer indication of date would come from closer inspection, particularly internally.

Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, in two entries - Tyn Twll Uchaf and Tyn Twll Isaf; both owned by John Davies Esq and Robert Roberts, the former a farmstead of over 70 acres occupied by Robert Ellis and Edward Roberts and the latter over 60 acres farmed by David Tudor.

The present farmhouse may have originally been 2 dwellings, now converted into a single house.

## Exterior

Two storey farmhouse, a linear range built of local stone; slate roof with massive external stone gable stacks. The principal range faces the lake to E and has boarded doors under shallow overlights with glazing bars; modern timber casements. To rear is a single storey addition with a shallow pitch roof of corrugated metal sheeting. Above the addition the head of a window opening is visible in the rear elevation and it can be seen that the roof has been partially reslated, suggesting the former presence of a dormer window or rear wing.

## Interior

The interior retains large chamfered cross beams and exposed joists.

### REPORT:

An appointment letter was sent, but when I arrived at the property the owner, an elderly gentleman, did not appear to have had the letter or to understand what the survey was about. I tried to discuss the survey and explain what I wanted to do, but whether or not his incomprehension was because his first language is welsh and I am not fluent enough to explain clearly or not I wouldn't like to say. I did not feel comfortable to carry out the survey at that time and feel that the building would benefit from an internal inspection.

### Location

Set back from the E side of a country road which leads SSE off the A470 to S of Trawsfynydd to Penystryd and on to Abergeirw and Dolgellau.

### History

Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, as a farmstead of over 197 acres; owned by Catherine Lloyd, Anne Jones and Owen Owens and occupied by Robert Pugh.

### Exterior

Two storey farmhouse built of rubble masonry; slate roof with advanced eaves and rectangular gable stacks with dripstones and capping. The principal elevation is a 3-window range of small paned sash windows and central doorway.

### Listed

#### REPORT:

The owner of the property contacted Cadw direct to state that he did not wish a survey to be undertaken at this time as he will shortly be admitted to hospital. A brief description has been drafted of the farmhouse, which should be updated when a proper survey is undertaken; there would also appear to be farm buildings of potentially listable quality at the property.

### Location

Set back below the SW side of a country road which leads W off the A470 to the S of the village of Trawsfynydd.

### History

Early C19 farmhouse. Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, as a farmstead of over 108 acres; owned by Thomas Price Anwyl Esq., farmed and occupied by Lewis Griffiths and Richard Davies.

### Listed

#### REPORT:

An appointment letter was sent but the property is uninhabited and there was no reply to the letter and no one was present at the appointed time. The house is not visible from the road and it is not clear who the owners are. Appears to be a small early C19 farmhouse.

### **Location**

### **History**

Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, as a farmstead of over 166 acres; the farmstead was held in trust by the Trustees of the late Richard Parry Esq. and farmed and occupied by William Nicholas and Owen Williams.

### **Listed**

#### **REPORT:**

The owner of the property contacted Cadw direct to state that he did not wish a survey to be undertaken at this time. The property appears to be a single storey cottage which retains a strong vernacular character, but only the rear elevation is visible from the road and therefore a description could not be completed without an authorised visit being made to the property.

#### Location

Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, as an extensive farmstead of over 234 acres; the farmstead was held in trust by the Trustees of the late Richard Parry Esq and was farmed and occupied by Morris Roberts.

The owner of this property contacted Cadw directly to state that he did not wish a survey to be undertaken at this time. The farm is visible from the War Memorial to the west of the village, though not clearly enough to be able to describe clearly the farmhouse and associated farm buildings which also look to be of interest.

Recorded in the Tithe Apportionment of the parish, 1849, as an extensive farmstead of over 288 acres; the farmstead was held in trust by the Trustees of the late Richard Parry Esq and was farmed and occupied John Jones.

### Listed

The owner did not wish a survey of the property to take place. The farm is not clearly visible from the road, but looks to be of some interest and was formerly included on the list at Grade III.
