Our response

The mid-year population estimate for Wales in 2010 was 3,049,971 and the mid-year estimate for 2023, the latest year for which figures are available, was 3,164,404. NHS beds data are available for financial years from 2009-10. In 2010-11 there were an average of 12,149 NHS hospital beds in Wales. These were comprised of 7,998 acute beds (surgical acute, medical acute and 'other' acute) and 4,628 non-acute beds. In 2023-24 there were an average of 10,447 NHS hospital beds in Wales. These were comprised of 7,113 acute beds and 3,768 non-acute beds. Note that the long-term strategy for healthcare in Wales is to provide care closer to home by increasing community and GP services, meaning reduced demand for hospital beds over time. Advances in healthcare technology have also resulted in shorter lengths of stay and more day surgery. NHS beds data are published on the StatsWales website at the following address:

Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW) is responsible for collecting data on regulated social care services in Wales. Data are collected for the number of registered places in care home settings, but not specifically for the number of occupied or available beds. In March 2011, the earliest period for which published data are available, there were 27,218 places provided by adult and children's care homes in Wales. In March 2024 there were 26,350 places.
