## About Not In My Name

Established in 2012, Not in my Name raises awareness about VAWG. WIs recruit male ambassadors to make the White Ribbon promise to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women. Globally, 1 in 3 women experience physical or sexual violence. In a third of all UK female adult homicide, the suspect was the victim's partner or ex-partner (source: ONS). Ending violence against women is everyone's business and requires a whole society approach.

The event is an opportunity to learn about the impact of abuse and harassment on survivors and communities, and reaching out to the heart of rural communities to help tackle misogyny and harmful behaviours.
