Annex 1

You asked for a review of your request for recorded information as you believe that an exemption has been wrongly applied. Having reviewed the information and the exemptions that were applied I partly uphold your complaint.

Section 28 – Relations with the United Kingdom

The exemption states:

28(1) Information is exempt information if its disclosure under this Act would, or would be likely to, prejudice relations between any administration in the United Kingdom and any other such administration.

Upon review of the information in scope of your request, I have concluded that Section 28 was correctly applied, and your complaint is not upheld.

Within the original disclosure, it stated "I believe the public interest in this process is satisfied by information falling within the scope of this request already in the public domain, or which will be placed in the public domain at an appropriate time".

This reference was intended to refer to anticipated ad hoc First Minister references to the contacts in question. However, following a review of the information I have concluded that this argument was incorrectly applied. The information is not in the public domain in any systematic discoverable way, nor is there any indication at that it will be in the future. Consequently, your complaint has been partly upheld. However, in my view the arguments in respect of the application of Section 28 for withholding the information are still valid despite this finding.
