Just had the response below from North Wales Police

The Serious and Organised Crime Unit (SOCU) in force are investigating a very small, yet complex, number of grooming investigations. Both have Senior Investigation Officer oversight.

Generally, the SOCU and Protecting Vulnerable Persons Unit (PVPU) have a wellestablished utilisation of 'Operation Hydrant' plus North Wales has a Gold Group running specifically for the management and oversight of grooming investigations. This is chaired by a Detective Chief Superintendent and meets monthly. That Gold Group reports in to force governance structures so there is chief officer oversight. Finally, given the NWP force area covers six local authorities, we have an excellent working relationship with the various safeguarding teams in each LA which gives us quick and ready access at the point of demand, should it be required.
