

**GORCHYMYN CEFNFFORDD YR A40
(PONTARGOTHI, SIR GAERFYRDDIN)
(GWAHARDD CERBYDAU DROS DRO) 2025**

Mae Gweinidogion Cymru wedi gwneud Gorchymyn o dan adran 14 o Ddeddf Rheoleiddio Traffig Ffyrdd 1984. Mae angen y Gorchymyn arfaethedig er mwyn gwneud gwaith ar gefnffordd yr A40, neu gerllaw iddi, ym Mhontargothi, Sir Gaerfyrddin.

Effaith y Gorchymyn yw gwahardd dros dro bob cerbyd rhag mynd ar y darn o bont y gefnffordd dros Afon Cothi sy'n ymestyn o fynedfa tramwyfa tŷ Neuadd Cothi hyd at gyffordd Ffordd Afon Cothi ym Mhontargothi

Y llwybr arall ar gyfer gyrwyr sy'n dymuno teithio tua'r dwyrain o bwynt gorllewinol y darn o'r ffordd sydd ar gau fydd mynd ar yr A40 tua'r gorllewin hyd at gylchfan yr A40/A485; tua'r de-orllewin i ymuno â'r A48 tua'r dwyrain wrth Gylchfan Pensarn hyd at gylchfan Crosshands; tua'r gogledd ar yr A476 hyd at y gyffordd yn Ffair-fach; tua'r gogledd ar yr A483 hyd at gylchfan Llandeilo, yna tua'r gorllewin ar yr A40 i Bontargothi. Y llwybr arall ar gyfer gyrwyr sy'n dymuno teithio tua'r gorllewin o bwynt dwyreiniol y darn o'r ffordd sydd ar gau fydd i'r gwrthwyneb.

Daw'r Gorchymyn i rym ar 25 Mehefin 2025. Bydd y gwaharddiad dros dro yn weithredol yn ystod oriau'r nos yn unig (20:00 o'r gloch tan 06:00 o'r gloch) a disgwylir iddo gael ei wneud yn ysbeidiol dros 4 diwrnod rhwng 25 Mehefin 2025 a 1 Medi 2025 neu hyd nes y caiff yr arwyddion traffig dros dro eu symud ymaith yn barhaol.

Dim ond yn ystod y cyfnod a bennir uchod y disgwylir i'r Gorchymyn fod yn weithredol. Er hynny, bydd yn parhau'n ddilys am gyfnod o 18 mis ar y mwyaf rhag ofn y bydd angen ailamserlennu'r gwaith neu wneud gwaith canlyniadol neu waith arall. Bydd hysbysiad am unrhyw newidiadau i'r amseroedd a'r dyddiadau yn cael ei arddangos cyn gwneud unrhyw waith a ailamserlennir.

**THE A40 TRUNK ROAD PONTARGOTHI,
CARMARTHENSHIRE) (TEMPORARY
PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES) ORDER 2025**

The Welsh Ministers have made an Order under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which is necessary to undertake works on or near the A40 trunk road at Pontargothi, in Carmarthenshire.

The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit all vehicles from proceeding on the length of the trunk road bridge over the Afon Cothi that extends from the driveway entrance of Neuadd Cothi House to the junction of River Cothi Road in Pontargothi.

The alternative route for drivers wishing to travel east from the western point of closure is westwards on the A40 to the A40/A485 roundabout; southwestwards to join the eastbound A48 at Pensarn Roundabout to Crosshands roundabout; northbound on the A476 to the junction at Ffairfach; northbound on the A483 to Llandeilo roundabout, then westbound on the A40 to Pontargothi. The alternative route for drivers wishing to travel west from the eastern point of closure will be vice versa.

The Order will come into force on 25 June 2025. The temporary prohibition will operate during night-time hours only (20:00 hours to 06:00 hours) and is expected to be carried out intermittently over 4 days from 25 June 2025 to 1 September 2025, or until the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

Although the Order is only expected to be in force during the period specified above it will remain valid for a maximum period of 18 months, as a contingency, should the work need to be rescheduled, or consequential or other work is required. Notice of any changes to times and dates will be given before any rescheduled work begins.
