ATISN 24845 - Increase in Council Tax since 2000

Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 19 June. You asked:

- By how much and by what percentage has the total revenue generated by council tax increased since 2000?
- What is the current percentage of a council budget supported by the Welsh Government excluding any special grants/funding etc.

Our response

The information you requested is as follows.

- The amount of revenue generated by council tax in 2000-01 was £590 million, and in 2025-26 is budgeted to be £2.323 billion. This represents an increase of £1.732 billion or 294%.
- Welsh Government support, excluding specific grants will be £5.003 billion in 2025-26, representing 60% of the total budget of councils in Wales. To answer this question we have made a number of assumptions. We interpreted 'council budget' as meaning the total budget for all councils in Wales, rather than an individual council. The 60% is arrived at by calculating £5.003bn that is provided by the Welsh Government in Revenue Support Grant to councils, as a proportion of £8.271bn budgeted revenue expenditure by councils excluding specific grants.
