I hope this email finds you well.

During our recent engagement session, I overlooked mentioning an important point regarding the model. Specifically, when discussing the "Gender identity", we are proposing that this data item would be **optional** for the following reasons:

- 1. Babies cannot be assigned a gender identity, and the same applies to some children.
- 2. Certain individuals with developmental or mental health issues may have difficulty interpreting the question.
- 3. Some individuals do not identify with a gender.

As well, gender identity *should not* be assumed.

Whilst we propose that "Gender Identity" is an optional field, for the reasons stated, we appreciate that it may be required as a mandatory piece of information for some use cases. The proposed model is intended to provide flexibility and allow for specific systems to mandate its collection where necessary, allowing individual implementations to align with their unique requirements and objectives. For example, if a Sexual health clinic required that this information be provided, this could be achieved through implementation in its respective systems.
