## Annex 1

Our AI Plan for Wales to harness the transformative power of artificial intelligence:

1. What is the environmental impact to Wales for this intensive roll out.

The [AI Plan for Wales](#) contains a range of strategic commitments which will be underpinned by delivery of specific initiatives to support the pillars of the plan. Specific impacts - such as on the environment - will be assessed as part of the delivery of individual aspects of the Plan. This broader approach is outlined in the related [Integrated Impact Assessment \(IIA\)](#) for the Plan.

2. What measures are in place to ensure reduced environmental impact.

As noted in the 'Equitable Delivery' section of the AI Plan for Wales, the Welsh Government aims to develop a deeper understanding of the environmental impact of AI and provide Welsh public services with guidance on how this can be minimised, where appropriate.

3. How & when will this be reviewed.

The Authority does not have details on when and how this will be reviewed.

4. How will information provided by artificial intelligence machines be vetted for accurate information.

The AI Plan for Wales recognises the risks around misinformation and potential inaccuracies of AI generated information. Public bodies in Wales - as individual organisations - will be expected to issue advice, guidance and training to support staff on the use of AI generated outputs. The Authority itself provides guidance to staff on the due diligence required to check all AI related outputs. This includes as part of a wider Senior Information Risk Owner (SIRO) Notice, a PDF copy of which has been included for reference.
