Which team of consultants were the main lead in producing the SFS?

Our response

Welsh Government have produced the Sustainable Farming Scheme (SFS). Consultants were not responsible for the production of SFS and therefore the WG does not hold any recorded information.

Third party suppliers, such as research organisations, were used to develop and provide the evidence base for the scheme and to estimate potential impacts of evolving scheme design. These suppliers were not responsible for producing the scheme.

What has been the total cost of producing the SFS, including the original scheme that was shown to be unworkable?

Our response

The total cost of producing the SFS is £2,931,216.83. This relates to evidence provided to inform the development and impact assessment of the scheme.

The WG does not hold any recorded information for costs of staff or resources for policy development time.

How many years did it take to formulate the SFS?

Our response

The Welsh Government has been developing the SFS as its proposed replacement for the Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) through an iterative process. The first consultation Brexit and our Land was published in 2018. Some parts of the SFS are still under development, with Optional and Collaborative Actions due to be phased in throughout the Transition Period (2026 – 2029).

What is the budgeted cost of running the SFS over the next 5 years?

Our response

Welsh Government published a projected annual budget for SFS of £378.7m (Table 52 page 85 [Sustainable Farming Scheme: full business case with annexes](#)), excluding the departmental running costs of Welsh Government staff supporting policy development and scheme delivery.
