

North Wales **Tim Emrallt** Tim Emrallt is an advisory service with the main role of providing consultancy and advice regarding assessment and intervention for children and young people presenting with sexually problematic or harmful behaviours. It is the team's responsibility to develop the skills of the children's services workforce, Youth Justice Service, health and education and partner agencies to raise awareness and confidence in dealing with this type of behaviour. The team's key objective is to ensure that problematic and harmful sexual behaviours are addressed as quickly as possible by providing training and mentoring with a focus on front loading preventative practice. This includes contributing to the development of resources within Gwynedd to understand and manage problematic and harmful behaviour by supporting the primary carers of children and young people to confidently assess and undertake HSB restorative practice.

Aims to upskill and support practitioners working with children across sectors; establish a Harmful Sexual Behaviour Forum for practitioners from social care teams, education and Health in Gwynedd. A multi-disciplinary model to encourage a diverse group of practitioners to work together and gain further understanding of this complex work.	Universal	RIF; three full-time practitioners, supported by an independent practitioner for two days a week.	HSB is a challenging and complex area of work ever evolving due to the changes in social media and access to the internet and there is a need for practitioners to keep up to date with new research and models of assessment and feel confident in providing intervention particularly for TAHSB.
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The team has focused on developing tailored resource packs for practitioners and parents. These include separate packs for children under 12 and those aged 12-18, which have been piloted with young people and shared with Tim Derwyn to ensure they cater to young people with additional learning needs.
